

TRIANGULAR POOL SHAWL

This triangular shawl was designed using Head over Heels All Stars in the striped colour way 'Pool'. Shades of blue and green were inspired by a David Hockney swimming pool painting. Knitted in a combination of stocking stitch and simple eyelet rows which repeat throughout the shawl ending with a delicate picot edging.

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 198cm Length 60cm

Stitch patterns used in this shawl:

Stocking Stitch with increases (RS) k2, yo, k to marker, yo, sm, k1, sm, yo, k to last two sts, yo, k2.

(WS) k2, yo, p to marker, sm, p1, sm, p to last two sts, yo, k2.

Eyelet Pattern

(WS) k2, yo, k to marker, sm, k1, sm, k to last two sts, yo, k2.

(RS) k2, *yo, k2tog, repeat from * to one st before marker, yo, k1, sm, k1, sm, k1, *yo, k2tog, repeat to last two stitches, yo, k2.

Picot Edging Cast Off

- 1. To start knit 2 stitches, pass first stitch over second stitch, as you would for a cast off stitch.
- 2. Pass the stitch from the right hand needle back over to the left hand needle.
- 3. Make two stitches onto the left hand needle by making backward loops.
- 4. Cast off four stitches.

Repeat picot cast off instructions, 2, 3, 4 as required.

YOU WILL NEED

2 x 100g balls of Head over Heels All Stars 75% Superwash Wool, 25% Nylon Shawl photographed in Pool 3918 1 x 4mm (UK8 - US 6) circular needle at least 80cm, 31½in, long to accommodate the number of stitches (to knit flat) 2 x stitch markers Tapestry needle for weaving in ends

TENSION

19 st and 28 rows to 10cm, 4in, measured over pattern using 4mm needles.

ABBREVIATIONS

RS right side WS wrong side pm place marker sm slip marker St(s) stitches
St st stocking stitch
yo yarn over
k2tog knit 2 stitches
together

k knit **p** purl

cm centimetre(s)
in inch(es)

g grammes

mm millimetre(s)

Set up rows

Cast on 7 sts using 4mm needles.

Knit two rows.

Next row: (RS) k2, yo, k1, yo, pm, k1, pm, yo, k1, yo, k2 (11 sts)

Next row: (WS) k2, yo, p3, sm, p1, sm, p3, yo, k2 (13 sts)

Shawl instructions

- 1. Next work 21 rows of stocking stitch with increases, ending with a RS row.
- 2. Work Eyelet pattern rows in the following sequence WS, RS, WS (3 rows)
- 3. Work 15 rows st st with increases.
- 4. Work Eyelet Pattern rows in the following sequence WS, RS, WS (3 rows)
- 5. Work 15 rows st st with increases.
- 6. Work Eyelet Pattern rows in the following sequence WS, RS, WS, RS, WS, RS, WS (7 rows)
- 7. Work 15 rows st st with increases.
- 8. Work Eyelet Pattern rows in the following sequence WS, RS, WS, RS, WS, RS, WS (7 rows)
- 9. Work 15 rows st st with increases.
- 10. Work Eyelet Pattern rows in the following

sequence WS, RS, WS, RS, WS, RS, WS (7 rows)

- 11. Work 15 rows st st with increases.
- 12. Work Eyelet pattern rows in the following sequence WS, RS, WS, RS, WS, RS, WS, RS, WS, (9 rows)
- 13. Work 15 rows st st with increases.
- 14. Work Eyelet pattern rows in the following sequence, WS, RS, WS (3 rows)
- 15. (RS) K2, yo, p to marker, sm, p1, sm, p to last 2 sts, yo, k2.
- 16. (WS) Cast off using Picot Edging Cast Off stitch

Finishing

Block the shawl and weave in loose ends
